

Article for October 2016 Box Parish Magazine – deadline Wednesday September 14th

Almost four years after their first visit to Box our friends from Sorigny arrived on Friday September 2nd for the ‘marriage’ between our two villages. The ‘courtship’ had taken place with many visits and ups and downs over the years but finally it ended in the public ceremony of ‘twinning’ on Sunday 4th – an historic day for both villages.

In the lead up to Sunday the Box committee and helpers entertained our guests with drinks on arrival at the home of Corinne and Thierry Sarkissian, a shopping trip to Bath, ‘parlour games’ at Kev and Annie Ford’s home and a pub meal and skittles at The White Hart, Atworth, where Corinne Burgain-Bertoia was declared champion .



With a formal ceremony in the Box Pavilion, in front of invited guests, Stewart Barnes (PC Chair) welcomed our visitors, Alain Esnault (Mairie de Sorigny) responded whilst our MP James Gray emphasised the importance of international links between individuals of different countries. Fred Shepherd, our President, stressed the value of linking Box with Sorigny and encouraged young families to get involved to enjoy the cultural exchanges between us. Leader of Wiltshire Council, Baroness Scott, spoke of twinning experiences throughout Wiltshire and presented the Mairie with a mounted Wiltshire Crest for his office.



The official signing of a Friendship Charter between the two villages will be repeated again in Sorigny next year over the weekend March 25/26th – more details will follow.



In a unique move Box initiated the signing of a 'Junior Charter' to strengthen the bonds between the young people of Box and Sorigny – our signatories were Nell Callaway, Isabelle Nash and Amelia White – they didn't have to make speeches!

With the hoisting of each nation's flag, including Wiltshire's, the ceremony concluded with rousing renditions of our national anthems.



To underline the solemnity of the morning's events the participants attended a Service of Prayer and Dedication for the Twinning and for the World arranged by Rev. Dr. Janet Anderson- MacKenzie, Priest in Charge at St. Thomas a Becket Church, where our French visitors read bible passages in French – a very moving end to the day's celebrations.
